



**Construction Notice**  
**Mill Valley-Sausalito Multi-Use Pathway Roundabout at Bayfront Park**  
**October 13, 2014**

The City of Mill Valley is pleased to announce a pedestrian and bicycle improvement project that will take place this fall at the Mill Valley-Sausalito multi-use pathway. This construction project, which is coordinated by the County of Marin, aims at calming traffic on the Bayfront Park section of the pathway.

The project will reconstruct the junction of the east end of Sycamore Avenue and the Mill Valley-Sausalito multi-use path. The improvements include the construction of a bicycle/pedestrian roundabout, a plaza, a drinking fountain, a bike map kiosk, landscape, garbage receptacles, pavement markings and signage. The newly constructed pathway on Sycamore Avenue will serve as the west leg of the roundabout.

Construction of this project will take place from Monday, October 13 through end of December. Construction will take place Monday through Friday from 8:30 am to 5:00 pm.

Project Location

The construction work will impact pedestrian and bicyclist access to the multi-use path. Work crews will provide a temporary detour path during construction. Parking will be temporarily restricted at the end of Sycamore Avenue. Construction will not affect emergency vehicles at any time. Residents and visitors should expect traffic delays and periods of increased traffic for the duration of the project. Traffic control operators and traffic control signage will be available to direct traffic flow as needed.

Guided by its Core Values to preserve health and safety and the community's high quality of life, the Mill Valley City Council established multimodal transportation as one of its Key Issues. The City Council has appointed the members of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee to recommend updates to the Bicycle and Pedestrian Transportation Plan and provide a venue for public input on matters related to bicycle and pedestrian facilities and programs.

The City would like to thank Marin County Public Works and Marin County Open Space for the construction of this project. The City would also like to thank the Mill Valley Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee, Mill Valley Parks and Recreation Commission, and Safe Routes to Schools Task Force members who assisted in the development of these improvements and were instrumental in voicing the needs of the community.

The total project cost is \$368,000 and is funded through Measure A and the County's general fund.
