




2020-21 SECOND INTERIM REVENUE

COVID-19 One-Time Resources: Allowable Uses

- Student Learning Supports
- Extended instructional time for students and additional core academic student supports
- Integrated services that support teaching and learning -- such as technology needs, mental health services, staff professional development, and student nutrition
- Addressing health and safety concerns
- Any purpose consistent with providing in-person instruction -- such as COVID-19 testing, cleaning and
 disinfection, personal protective equipment, ventilation, and other school site upgrades necessary for health
 and safety, salaries for employees providing in-person instruction or services, and mental health support
 services provided in conjunction with in-person instruction
- Learning recovery, Integrated student supports to address other barriers to learning, and Learning hubs
- Supports for credit-deficient students
- Very broad discretion to use ESSER funds to support coronavirus response activities
- Materials necessary to provide students with opportunities for distance learning
