## 2. Treasurer's Report

- a. Goal of 120k to be raised, \$133,734.00 to date.
- b. Stampede auction numbers not finalized but looking good and over what was estimated
- c. No garden tiles this year due to lack of chair
- d. No longer auctioning the parking spot due to lack of raffle participation

## 3. Principal's Report

- a. Thank PTA and Tina Soppitt, spirit wear was given to staff at cost, all staff now has spirit wear
- b. Annual large disaster drill on Oct 26th. It went well, full accurate account of children within 7 minutes, found everyone within 20. Dismissal of students to parents takes the longest and needs most improvement.
- c. Zero waste is up and running, 3 bin system in place, as of Monday everything was crossed and in the wrong bin. Tuesday was better, wednesday had even more improvement.
- d. Long term efforts to aid Napa/Sonoma counties from the fires. Maybe partner with Redwood Adventist Academy, they are a garden school as well. About 80 kids, K-5. we selected them as they are a garden school too. Christine Mueller is the parent connection.
- e. Conferences are up and coming, it's always a lot of work, about 2 hours/child goes into prep and conference
- f. Kristy is organizing treats for staff for conf week
- g. LCAP review
  - i. See 2 handouts
  - ii. LCFF Local Control Funding Formula, we are back in basic aid, meaning local taxes exceed state minimums, LCAP, we don't have a lot of children



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being underserved, for example: San Rafael schools get a lot more LCFF funding

- iii. Over 1000 MV people participate in LCAP and present to MCOE. LCAP reports on 8 state priorities, basic services, etc.
- iv. Jackie asked about social/emotional intervention that came up with Paul Johnson's town hall meeting. The subject came up at other schools and also with the teachers. It's goal #2 of state required LCAP goal.
- v. Leslie Wachtel there are 2 open forums for parents who have not attended these informative LCAP meetings
- vi. Website has input option for LCAP
- vii. Regarding social/emotional intervention parents need to be very vocal.
- viii. Discussion arose regarding how to get momentum around issues such as need for more counselors. Parents definitely have a voice when they use it.
- ix. Technology integration Leo's opinion is that it wasn't there until about 2008 as he's a somewhat tech skeptic.
